Forty Carrots Receives Grant to Provide Parenting Education at First Step

Using a strength-based, non-judgmental approach, FCFC builds protective factors that are shown by research to reduce the risk of abuse and neglect within families. Additionally, the classes emphasize improving the parent-child bond that is instrumental to healthy relationships later in life and empowering parents to be their child's first teacher.
