The Center hosts 270 fee-based parenting classes annually, serves as home base for Forty Carrots parenting educators who travel to more than 14 locations delivering more than 700 free parenting education classes to 3,000 parents

Strength of Mind

Forty Carrots, Dr. David Walsh Teach Parents the Psychological Importance of Saying No

@aying "No" doesn't come naturally to Sarasota mom Lisa McQuaid, a graphic artist whose warm and generous nature is challenged at times by her 4-year-old daughter's spirited march toward independence.

Inquisitive and headstrong from the day she was born, Morgan often resists Lisa's gentle attempts to set limits and redirect the preschooler's interests.

"I don't feel good about constantly saying 'No' and 'Don't,'

barking threats and being a complete authoritarian," Lisa said, "but sometimes it seems that's the only way she will listen to me."

And so it was with intrigue and hope that Lisa recently attended Forty Carrots Family Center's 6th annual speaker event. The event featured noted psychologist and award-winning author Dr. David Walsh discussing his

latest book, No: Why Kids—of All Ages—Need to Hear It and Ways Parents Can Say It. More than 1,000 parents packed the Hyatt Regency Sarasota ballroom on Oct. 7 to hear

what Dr. Walsh had to say.

Not surprisingly, Dr. Walsh's message was both simple and complex. He explained how today's "Yes" culture of "MORE, EASY, FAST, and FUN" undermines children's self discipline—a character trait that research reveals is twice as strong a predictor of success in school and life than is intelligence.

"Our job as parents is to give our kids the skills to not only enjoy the happy times ... but also to cope with unhappiness, frustration and all the normal bumps in the road," he said. By personally dealing with disappointment, they develop the self-assurance and self-confidence that prepares them to handle the next problem that comes along.

For Lisa, and others who attended the event, Dr. Walsh's presentation was empowering. She enrolled in a follow-up class at Forty Carrots—based on Dr. Walsh's book—that helped her develop a more balanced parenting style. Neither too authoritarian nor too permissive, it builds on the warmth and connection she wants in her parent-child relationship.

"I really appreciate having an organization like Forty Carrots to help families in our community," said Lisa. "I feel so supported in my job as a parent, and have learned from and been inspired by the advice and books I've received at their classes and annual events."

Once again, Forty Carrots' community speaker event was free thanks to support from our community sponsors.

Sound Advice for the Entire Community

uring his visit, Dr. David Walsh shared a similar message with community and business leaders during a breakfast presentation and then gave a special after school presentation to teachers. Preparation for success in school and civic life, however, starts at home. To help your children succeed in school and life, Dr. Walsh shares his top 10 parenting tips:

- 1. Learn how to say NO.
- 2. Support, don't rescue
- 3. Encourage, don't coddle.
- 4. Get kids what they need but not everything they want.
- 5. Back up teachers and schools.
- 6. Have clear and high expectations.
- 7. Expect kids to do chores.
- 8. Set and enforce clear limits and consequences.
- 9. Expect kids to volunteer and help others.
- 10. Last but not least, become MediaWise®—keep up with the capability of the latest technology and watch what your kids watch.




