INFANT BRAIN SAFETY

WITH FIRST STEP MOTHERS AND INFANTS AND SOLVE MATERNITY HOME

To support the discussion and provide a concrete understanding, the demonstration utilized the "brain baby" and an egg in a baby jar, as props, to show the difference in safe baby handling and strong movements that can damage delicate brains in the early months. Group members were encouraged to share personal examples of how they keep their babies safe in different circumstances. As always, a useful handout was given as a follow up with the symptoms of Shaken Baby Syndrome and brain injury that can be referred to at any time.

CHILD + FAMILY THERAPY NEW SUPPORT GROUP

FOR TEEN PARENTS

These groups were designed to give teen parents an opportunity to have dedicated time for their own mental health needs, with the belief that supporting and addressing parents' mental health will serve to promote the strengthening of infant-family and infant-caregiver relationships that will enhance overall development and well-being. Consisting of three 8-week sessions over the course of the school year, these group sessions focus on building community, discussing healthy communication and relationship skills, providing a space to reflect on past journeys along with future aspirations, and promoting healthy forms of coping and stress management.
