ASOLO REP STORYTELLING WITH FORTY CARROTS

Kim Dailey Preschool Director said, "This wonderful program bringing books, sensory experience, and the opportunities for the children to participate has been wonderful. When Sara comes to visit, the children are fully engaged, they tore paper and had a snowstorm in the room after reading the Book "Polar Bear in the Snow" by Mac Barnett. The children had a chance to act like snow. They imagined what they could do with a simple box after reading "Not A Box" by Antoinette. Children were racing in cars, sailing in boats, and hiding in a house so many opportunities when prompted to open their imagination. This program has been a great enhancement to the children's summer camps at Forty Carrots."



In the classroom, teachers expanded children's imagination by a more in-depth look at books. Some classes explored books in their classroom café and bookstore and traveled through books exploring nature, camping, and the beach. A favorite centered around camping and roasted marshmallows around a campfire, creating tents with blankets, and using flashlights inside their tents. Other classes, children explored their feelings with the help of the book "Color Monster" by Anna Llenas. They acted out

their feelings and shared ways to express their feelings. The class ended by creating their own color monster and had a parade through the wings of Forty Carrots. The deep dive into books with the teachers, Sara and Gaby teaching artists from Asolo Rep helped to create wonderful camp experiences.

Some youth allowed their creativity to flourish and created a variety of "personal needs plants" including a mushroom, cactus, palm tree, a 3D rose, and even a garden gnome. Once finished, group members shared and discussed their Personal Needs Plants with each other and "plant" them in the Community Garden in support and in representation of their needs.

A NEW VAN TO OUR FLEET!
