

corn and using fine motor skills to shuck the corn. You could hear



EXPLORING FALL

THROUGH ACTIVE PLAY

How does this active play and experiences enhance learning? Through endless open-ended questions: How does that feel? What do you think is inside the pumpkin? Comparing pumpkins and gourds, how are they the same and different? As the children are given the chance to explore and be curious, they are actively learning. Children are learning new words such as gourd, squash, husk, shuck and vocabulary to describe bumpy, smooth, and bright. Traveling around the playground in search of acorns helps with movement and balance. Socially children are exploring with friends, having conversations about





what they are doing or seeing and allowed to make their own choices, having patience to wait their turn and the experiences go on and on. Most importantly, the overall feeling is a feeling of happiness and kindness, the children are creating their own little community. In this space they can be themselves, be curious, be involved, and be allowed to wonder!

EXPLORING FEELINGS WITH TEEN PARENTS

AT CYESIS RIVERVIEW HIGH SCHOOL

Students recognize that the outward persona they present does not necessarily show what they are feeling inside and how it may impact parenting and the attachment with their child. Some of the emotions teens shared were "feeling alone, I am angry with everything, and exhaustion." With understanding and empathy, students can create the connections they want with others and their child. It's a journey of exploration, nurturing the needs of themselves and the children they care for. The experience resulted in a poignant exploration of self, ultimately fostering stronger, more genuine relationships with their children.

The positive impact of exercises such as this tends to become increasingly evident over time. Initially, as participants engage in these activities, they may start to notice small improvements in their interactions with their children and form a deeper sense of connection, leading to stronger bonds and trust. These effects may continue to evolve and deepen over the years, contributing to long-term success of the parent-child relationship, supporting positive family dynamics well into the future.
